Disbelieving, she looked again at the ultrasound. Her friend, also an ultrasound tech, sent the message back, "I see two."

Working for a medical center in Pueblo, a newly pregnant Maegan had taken the opportunity to "self-scan". (Much like when you use the self-check-out option at the market, only WAY different.) Already a mom to three-year-old Everleigh, she and Dominic were thrilled to know they were again expecting. But, this. This was more than they expected!

Experienced at interpreting grainy ultrasounds, Maegan looked carefully, wondering if the twins she was carrying might be conjoined, as they were so close.

An ultrasound at 12 weeks' showed her twins were indeed close, as they were monomono twins. Monoamniotic twins are identical. In addition to sharing space in utero, they also share the amniotic sac and placenta, with each having their own umbilical cord.

This same exam led Maegan and Dominic to believe their twins were boys, which was later confirmed with blood work.





The preparations began. Needing to find and secure an OB/GYN who specializes in delivering mono-mono twins, the goal was for Maegan to deliver no sooner than 32 weeks. However, life doesn't always go as planned. At 24 weeks, Maegan was hospitalized and monitored daily with multiple in-depth scans.

At 27 weeks' gestation, their sons arrived. Conner weighed 2 pounds, 11 ounces and Cameron was just 2 pounds, 6 ounces. Fitting into the palms of their parent's hands, the Perkins moved into our Ronald McDonald House, staying with us while their boys were hospitalized.

"I remember a friend saying, 'You didn't live in your home for five months?! That's crazy!', but, the truth is, it wasn't crazy. Your House became our HOME". Maegan said. "Cameron was in the NICU for 105 days, with Conner adding another 50 days to his stay at Children's Hospital." Each and every one of those days (and nights), Maegan, Dominic and Everleigh were just a minute away at our Ronald McDonald House.

While hospitalized, the boys required four emergency surgeries, three of them at 2 am. "Being so close at your House allowed us to get over to the hospital and see the boys before they went into each surgery," Dominic said.

"When the majority of our time, energy and thoughts were with the boys, staying with you meant that we didn't have to worry about everyday things." Dominic went on. "Anytime an emergency arose, we were grateful to be so close."

Maegan added, "As a family, we all felt so comfortable here. The House became our home, with your staff and volunteers welcoming us in. You were always checking on the boys and Everleigh was so very loved!"





That's what our Ronald McDonald House does. We care for families who are facing unforeseen medical crisis, attending to all of their needs, so that their primary focus is being with their hospitalized children.

Maegan said, "You helped us transition from being a family of three, with both parents working, to overnight becoming a family of five, with Dominic, Everleigh and I at the House full-time."

Even with the support from their families, Maegan said, "We couldn't have done any of this without the Ronald McDonald House. We were looking at a high-risk pregnancy with me being hospitalized from 24 weeks, on." She continued. "We imagined that we

might have a one-month NICU stay, and that turned into five months."

Dominic finished her thought. "Mentally, physically and financially, **we would not have survived without your help."** Maegan added, "Our situation was impossible. Your care made it possible for us to be there for our boys and for our daughter."

Today, Dominic is the boys in-home CNA, providing for their daily needs. Each with different diagnoses, the Perkins continue to come to Colorado Springs to receive the specialized medical care their boys require. Now, at 14 months old, Conner weighs 21lbs and Cameron weighs 17lbs.

"Staying at the House during both Thanksgiving and Christmas was special.", Maegan said. "Celebrating the holidays with you helped us feel like we were home. You loved our family well." Maegan went on, "Even with a surgery the day before Thanksgiving, you took great care of all of us." She closed her eyes, smiled, and said, "During a season when we typically 'give thanks,' we simply cannot thank you enough."


